The custom of sacrificing roosters (butchering roosters) is an ancient one. The harvest time ends on the  $26^{th}$  of October and winter begins.

The sacrifice was for thanking the gods of Thrace so that they kept the villagers healthy during the summer. It is a residue of idololatric times and for this reason the Metropolite tried to stop the revival of the custom in 1916.
