



World Congress on Engineering Asset Management (WCEAM 2009) Workshop: 'eTraining in Maintenance'

A workshop will be held, aiming at demonstrating the use of existing e-training solutions for Maintenance and Engineering Asset Management training. The workshop is an initiative of the EU *iLearn2Main* project (Industrial System for Modern Enterprise Maintenance – www.ilearn2main.eu) with the support of the *Hellenic Maintenance Society* (HMS).
